



Article I, Section 8, clause 8, of the United States Constitution states the purpose of copyright laws is "to promote the Progress of Science and useful Arts, by securing for limited

- Copyright attaches as soon as the original work is created
- Copyright is an automatic right and does not require the author to file special paperwork (although you can)
- The copyright owner has the right to do four things (called exclusive rights):

 - Prepare derivative works based on the copyrighted work; and
 Distribute copies of the copyrighted work to the public by sale, rental or lending, and/or to display the image.

TYPES OF IMAGES

YOUR OWN IMAGES

- OK to use
- Customer's property • In contract OK to use
- Down size the images to 72 DPI on web – less chance of being stolen
- Might want to watermark

PUBLIC DOMAIN

• A public domain image is defined as a photo, clip art or vector whose copyright has expired or never existed in the first place. These images can be used by almost anyone for personal and commercial purposes. (Creative Commons Zero)

TYPES OF IMAGES - CREATIVE COMMONS

- CCO Creative Commons Zero no copyright, no licensing, no attribution is needed, but if you can...do it!
- CC BY Attribution distribute, remix, tweak, and build upon a work, even commercially, just provide attribution.
- or CC BY-SA remix, tweak, and build upon a work even for commercial purposes, as long as you credit and license your new creations under the identical terms.

 This license is often compared to "copyleft" free and open source software licenses. All new works based on the original work will carry the same license, so any derivatives will also allow commercial use. This is the license used by Wikipedia, and is recommended for materials that would benefit from incorporating content from Wikipedia and similarly licensed projects.

TYPES OF IMAGES - CREATIVE COMMONS

- CC BY-ND This license allows for redistribution, commercial and non-commercial, as long as it is passed along unchanged and in whole, with credit to original creator.
- C BY-NC This license lets others remix, tweak, and build upon a work non-commercially, and although their new works must also acknowledge original creator and be non-commercial, they don't have to license their derivative works on the same terms.
- CC BY-NC-SA This license lets others remix, tweak, and build upon a work non-commercially, as long as they credit the original creator and license their new creations under the identical terms.
- * CC BY-NC-ND This license is the most restrictive of the six main licenses, only allowing
 others to download your works and share them with others as long as they credit original
 creator, but they can't change them in any way or use them commercially.

TYPES OF IMAGES

FAIR USE

- BIG ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM...
- Fair use is a legal exception to the exclusive rights an owner has for his or her copyrighted work.
- To allow for *limited and reasonable uses* as long as the use does not interfere with owners' rights or impede their right to do with the work as they wish.



TYPES OF IMAGES



EDITORIAL

- Editorial Use is a publishing term based on the Fair Use exception of copyright law where copyrighted work can be used without authorization for purposes of news reporting, criticism, education, etc.
- Images that are MARKED as "editorial use only" are ones that have not been released for commercial use and have also been taken without the consent of the individuals in the photo.




TYPES OF IMAGES

ROYALTY FREE

 Means you can use the images forever there isn't a time limit on the images. Also you can use it over and over usually – but check with the license when you buy it.


RIGHTS MANAGED


Usually there is a time limit on how long you can use the image, video etc. Also usually good for one-time use – then you need to pay.

PERSONAL USE

"You can use it for free for personal use. Please give credit (something like: font used is Telegrafico by ficod + a link to my deviantart page if you can)."

COMMERCIAL USE

"If you're going to earn money for a project involving this font, I would consider correct to make a donation (send me an email/PM and I'll send you a link for donating by PayPal)." Or if this project is being used for a for-profit venture.

FONTS

EULA – End User Licensing Agreem – READ IT!!! Keep a copy in your licensing folder

Desktop and print licensing – basic comes loaded

Webfonts – may or may not display correctly – must be embedded correctly and must be created correctly so that if unable to display as that font, it shows a standard font.

Open Licensing (OFL) – like creative commons

Commercial – generally the better way to go if the font will be used on anything.
